## THE IDENTITY OF BULBINELLA CARNOSA

The South African species of *Bulbinella* are confined to the south-western Cape. An exception appeared to be *B. carnosa* (Bak.) Bak. which was originally described as *Anthericum carnosum* Bak. (Journ. Linn. Soc. (Bot.) 15: 296, 1876) but which he subsequently transferred to *Bulbinella* (Fl. Cap. 6: 358, 1896). It was based on a specimen collected by *Gerrard & McKen* 1890 (K, holo., NH) from Natal, from damp rocks between the rivers Umzinto and Ifafa.

I regard these binomials as synonyms of *Ornithogalum paludosum* Bak. (J. Bot., Lond. 12: 366, 1874), a species which at times forms an atypical rootsystem. Possibly due to a marshy habitat no firm bulb is formed, only a scaly swollen base.

Other synonyms include O. gracilentum Bak. (1897), O. ebulbe Schltr. (1907) and Anthericum quadrifidum Poelln. (1942).

Bulbinella burkei Benth., which is also recorded from the summer rainfall area in the Flora Capensis, has been transferred to *Trachyandra burkei* (Benth.) Oberm. (Bothalia 7:721, 1962).
